By 2030, reduce the global maternal mortality ratio to less than 70 per 100,000 live births



4 QUALITY EDUCATION
Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all



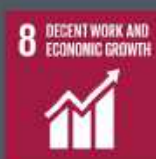
5 GENDER EQUALITY

Conserve and sustainably use the oceans, seas and marine resources for sustainable development



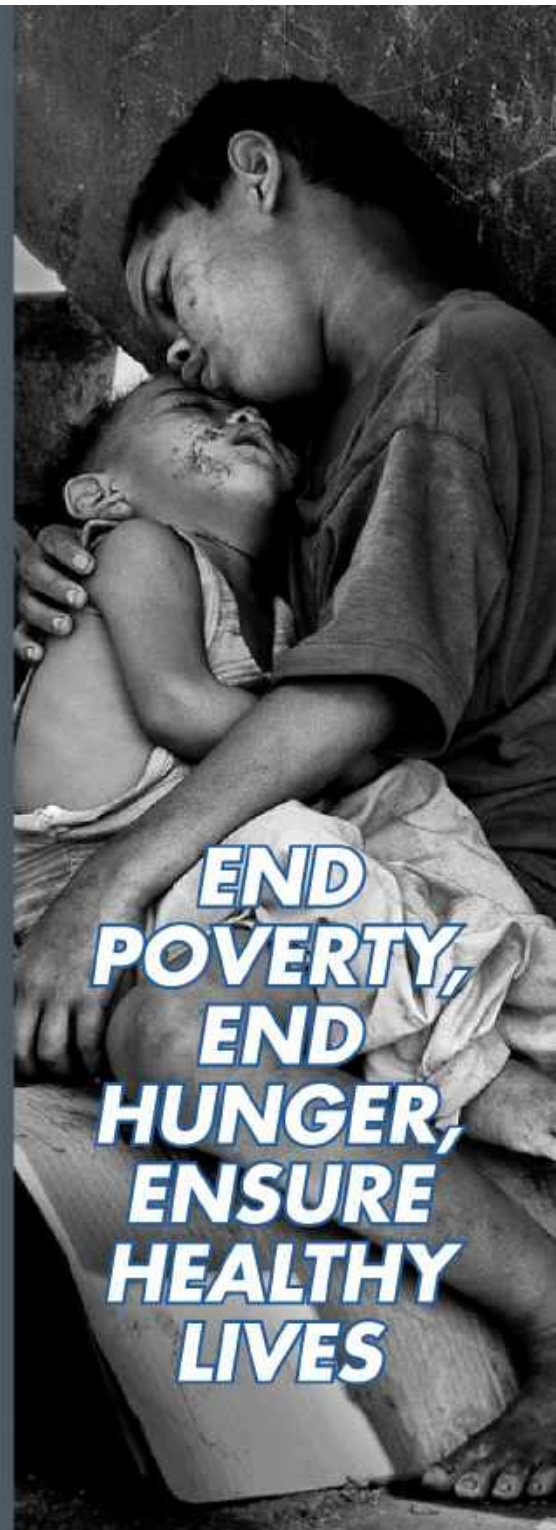
15 LIFE ON LAND

INDIA AND MSDGs

India as a member country of the United Nations and signatory to UN Sustainable Development Summit in September 2015 has adopted the SDGs 2030 as the guiding framework for its National Development Agenda till 2030. The prime objective of this universal agenda is to eradicate poverty in all its forms and dimensions including extreme poverty that is the greatest global challenge and an indispensable requirement for sustainable development. The SDGs 2030 includes 17 Goals with 169 targets. The SDGs framework is built on the millennium development goals and aims to realize the human rights of all and to achieve gender equality and empowerment of women by stimulating action in the areas of critical importance of humanity: the “economic, social and environmental”.

To achieve the Sustainable Development Goals, governments, businesses, civil society organisations and individuals will all need to get on board. Countries will have the opportunity to deliver Voluntary National Reviews showcasing progress towards the Goals. Sustainable Development Goals focus on areas like end of poverty, sustainable production and consumption, health and well-being, gender equality, clean water and sanitation, affordable clean energy, reduced inequalities, social peace and justice, development of partnerships, climate change action, life below water, life on land, decent work and economic growth, industry, innovation, infrastructure, sustainable cities and communities etc.

GLOBAL OUTREACH ON SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

As we move towards 2050, our planet will house a global population of 9 billion with close to 70 percent living in cities. This massive scale of urbanization is expected to result in doubling of the energy demand by 2050 with close to 75 percent of total demand arising from developing and emerging economies even if our current emission profile stagnates or reduces marginally. Therefore, it is paramount for us to plan, build and manage a low carbon growth for the world. A 4° C temperature rise with drastic climatic changes is very realistic possibility.
